SUBJECT: Environmental Management System (EMS) Commitment Statement

- 1. Per Air Force Instruction (AFI) 32-7001, *Environmental Management*, it requires installations to maintain an environmental commitment statement which supports DoDI 4715.17 and Air Force Policy Directive 90-8.

- a. Instill a culture that encourages and supports continual environmental improvement and pollution prevention that enhances mission effectiveness, minimizes risk, and preserves the workforce, natural, and manmade resources through effective planning and resource allocation.
- b. Comply with all environmental legal obligations and applicable regulations at the federal, state and local levels.
- c. Utilize EMS to identify environmental risks and aspects, establish objectives and targets to preserve our natural and cultural assets, reduce environmental risk and monitor the installation's environmental health.
- d. Provide required environmental awareness training for base personnel through the Air Force Civil Engineer Center and the 412th Civil Engineer Group, Environmental Management Division.
