c. Through the framework of our EMS, establish objectives and targets to reduce environmental risks associated with our daily activities throughout all operations.

d. Provide required environmental awareness training for base personnel through the Air Force Civil Engineer Center, Air Force Institute of Technology and the 412th Civil Engineer Group, Environmental Management Division.
