- f. Provides base wide training venues for personal awareness through the Air Force Civil Engineer Center and the 412th Civil Engineer Group, Environmental Management Division.
- g. Is documented, implemented and maintained by the Environmental Management Division and available on the Edwards AFB eDASH SharePoint page and the Edwards AFB Public website page.
